The General Society of Mayflower Descendants (GSMD) elected Jane Hurt as Governor General for the 2020 - 2023 term. During her term, GG Hurt will work with the Society's

Executive Committee and General Board of assistants to govern the Society's Plymouth, MA international headquarters and serve its 30,000 plus membership. Governor General

Hurt will lead a twelve-member Executive Committee that is tasked with setting policy and guiding the operation of the society through its Executive Director and staff in Plymouth, MA.

"Jane brings a breadth of knowledge from her leadership in many other lineal societies as well as her years of experience with GSMD," said former Governor General

George P. Garmany. "She will lead the Society as the fifth woman elected to this office."

Governor General Jane Hurt most recently completed a term at GSMD as Secretary General. A member of the Kansas Society, she has served as Governor, Historian, and

Webmaster. She has served as State Treasurer and Chapter Regent of the Kansas Daughters of the American Revolution; State Regent of the Kansas Daughters of the

American Colonists; State President of the Kansas Colonial Dames of the XVII Century; and is a life member of the Jamestowne Society. She is pleased to have proven her

IOWA MAYFLOWER SOCIETY SCHOL-ARSHIP - - - - Deadline extended to June 1st.

A \$500.00 scholarship will be paid to the post-high school institution the student attends after the first semester/term is completed.

Requirements:

The applicant must be a descendant from one of the Mayflower passengers who came to America in 1620. The applicant need not be a member of the lowa Society but must have a blood relative who is a member of the lowa Society. The ancestor and the lowa member's name and relationship to the applicant must be included.

The applicant must be a high school senior or a home school student who is the equivalent of a senior. The applicant must attend an accredited university, college, junior college, community college, or certified trade school.

Application must include at least two letters of recommendation from non-family members. The letters should include identification of the writer along with a home or business address, the relationship with the student and length of time he/she has known the student, and the student's qualities, which make the student an appropriate candidate for consideration.

A 500 word original typed or word-processed essay that includes a bibliography of at least two sources must be included.

A list including GPA, community service, school and/ or church, or any activities of importance should be provided. These activities are not mandatory, but are factors that may be considered. In the spirit of the Mayflower settlers seeking to better themselves by moving to a new and uncharted world, special consideration will be given to applicants who have demonstrated a commitment to bettering themselves. **The topic is**: Discuss the religious, societal and economic reasons that led to the voyage to the New World. The length and research requirements remain the same. Application Deadline for the 2022 GSMD Scholarship Program is June 1 2022. A relative of the applicant may not be a judge in the rating of applications.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, In November 1620 A.D. 102 Passengers on the ship Mayflower landed at Plymouth in the New World to establish a

new colony; and

WHEREAS. In the year following one half of the passengers perished in the horrible Winter from disease and terrible conditions;

WHEREAS, those that survived were able to erect suitable shelters, and with the assistance of Native Americans, to plant and harvest adequate crops sufficient to survive the next Winter; and

WHEREAS, in gratitude for their survival and fair prospects for the coming year they planned a grand dinner celebration to commemorate and invited the Native American Chief to join them; and

the Native American Chief came in attendance along with 95 of his tribe bringing 5 deer to the feast which is symbolic of the friendship and acceptance between races; and WHEREAS,

WHEREAS. it has been estimated that at least ten percent of Iowa's population are direct descendants of those passengers; and

this event and the Pilgrim passengers have become the basis and symbol of the American Thanksgiving Holiday, and 2021 is the four hundredth anniversary of First Thanksgiving celebration of the Passengers of the ship WHEREAS,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kim Reynolds, Governor of the State of Iowa, do hereby proclaim November 25th, 2021, as

FOUR-HUNDREDTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST THANKSGIVING



IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I HAVE HEREUNTO SUBSCRIBED MY NAME AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF IOWA TO BE AFFIXED. DONE AT DES MOINES THIS DAY OF NOVEMBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD TWO THOUSAND
